He moved with his parents to Cedar county, Iowa, in 1846, and later moved to VanBuren county, Iowa. when 17 years of age, he went to Garnette, Kansas, where he taught school for one year, later returning home to enter college at the Iowa Wesleyan University, graduating there. He was married to Mary A. MacDowell, in Ottumwa, Iowa, in 1861. He enlisted in Co. I, 45th Iowa Mfantry volunteers, where he served until he was honorably discharged in September, 1864. He moved to Adams county, Iowa, in 1865, settling in Nodaway township. In 1867 he was elected county superintendent and servied in that capacity for two terms. Later he moved to Washington, Kansas, where he engaged in teaching school, and was at this time admitted to the bar, for the practice of law. The following year he returned to Iowa, and bought a farm, three miles west of Corning. In 1877 he again moved to Corning and was a prominent business man here for a number of years. 
