Hon. Elvin Tilton died in this city Sunday evening, aged 74 years, 4 months and 14 days. The protracted hot weather was no doubt the cause of his death, but he has not been in good health for 19 years, being afflicted with shaking polsy.

The deceased has been a very active man of affairs until more recent years. He began life as a school teather and farmer, and then engaged in stock business, driving cattle over the mountains from Ohio to the western market in his younger days. He was the enrolling officer of Nobles county, Ohio, during the war, and after coming to Iowa he represented Iowa county in the 18th and 19th general assembly. He has always been a strong republican and a useful party worker in the years of his strength.

Hon. Elvin Tilton was born in Ohio township, Nobles county, Ohio. He was married to Miss Mary A. Jordan, of Nobles county, Nov. 16th, 1848, whs now survives him. The family moved from Ohio to Montezuma, Iowa, in 1864, and from there to Iowa county in 1865. In 1892 the family moved to Stuart, where they built the Stuart House, which they have since conducted.

Ten children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Tilton. One of the number died in infancy. The surviving children are, D. W. Tilton, of Wilson, Kan.; Cathrine A. Walter, of Fort Collins, Colo.; G. W. Tilton, of Deep River, Iowa; James E. 'Tilton, of Stuart, Iowa; Elijah Tilton, of Nashua, Iowa; Grant Tilton, also of Nashua; Wm. Tilton, of Lyons, Colo.; Mrs. Mary Seaton, of Hubbard, Iowa; Mrs. Emma Tourney, of Cripple Creek, Colo. and Mrs. Clara Lester, of Nashua, Iowa.

The deceased was a member of the Masonic order since 1880, and Token Lodge A. F. and A. M. of this place had charge of the funeral. The lodge accompanied the remains and mourners to Monteith, where the funeral services were held in the Christian church, Monday, Rev. Clampitt being in charge of the service.

His father was engaged in the lumber business and our subject's early youth was spent in attending school and helping his father in lumbering. In 1865 he came with his parents to Iowa county, where he has since resided. In April, 1869, he was married to Miss Susan McLaughlin, a native of Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania. They have three children: John, Herman and Charles. Mr. Wagner owns a farm of 80 acres.

WILSON, W. M.-Farmer and stock-dealer, Sec. 1, P. O. Millersburg. The subject of this sketch is the second son of William and Parmelia Hartsod Wilson. His father was a lineal descendant of Benjamin and Margaret Wilson, who came from Londonderry, Ireland, to Londonderry, New Hampshire; moved to Ackworth, of the same State, in 1774. Who was Elvin C Tilton?

He became engaged in the stock business, driving cattle over the mountains from Ohio to eastern markets. During the war of the Rebellion he was enrolling officer in Nobel county and vicinity of Prairie City and Des Moines. In 1864 came with his family to live, first in Montazuma, where he spent the winter of 1864 and 1865, buying and shipping stock. In the fall of 1879 Mr. Tilton was elected to represent Iowa county in the 18th General Assembly of Iowa, which duties he performed with such credit that his people reelected him in the fall of 1881 to represent them in the 19th General Assembly which duties he performed with equal credit and to the satisfaction of all, but he returned from Des Monies considerable broken in health. He always voted the Republican ticket and was a prominent worker and organizer in Iowa county. He was well versed in law and was the trusted adviser and counselor of many people who knew him and came to him in difficulty. He was always ready to help others out of trouble, and suffered financial reverse himself because of having helped others to much. No man was ever refused a reasonable favor if it was within his power to grant it. He was a liberal donator and supporter of the educational and religious institutions within his community. Although business matters often called him from his home at times, yet on man ever loved his family and home more dearly than he. No matter what time in the night he arrived at his rail road station, nor how cold and dark the night, he would make his way home to be with his family. In 1892 the family moved on to Stuart where they engaged in keeping the Stuart house.




