He had been a member of the Legislature of the State of Iowa. He was twice appointed by the Governors of Iowa a member of the State Board of Health. His remains were brought to Milton and interred April 12th; the pastor of the Milton Church officiating, assisted by Rev. Dr. Wardner. He
