The deceased was the son of the late Eld. O. P. Hull. He enlisted in the war of the rebellion when a little past 17 years of age, was a member of Co. L, 3d Wisconsin Volunteer Cavalry. He had been a member of the Legislature of the State of Iowa. He was twice appointed by the Governors of Iowa a member of the State Board of Health. His remains were brought to Milton and interred April 12th; the pastor of the Milton Church officiating, assisted by Rev. Dr. Wardner. He

leaves a widow, a son and daughter, who deeply mourn his decease. E.
