**COMMISSION IS ORGANIZED.**

Rules Formulated as to Examination of Voting Machines.

The Iowa State Voting Machine Commission organized Thursday evening, C. S. Osborn of Tabor, Iowa, was elected president; H. M. Belvel, secretary, and Wm. H. Blake, treasurer. At a meeting held at the state house yesterday forenoon, it was decided on motion of Osborn that parties having machines which they wish to sell in Iowa shall make application in writing to the president of the commission at Tabor, Iowa, accompanying the application with the required fees and necessary expense money, when it shall be the duty of the president to call a meeting of the commission at such time and place as agreed upon between himself and the owners of the machine, when and where such examination shall take place.

It was ordered on motion of Blake that in the examination of any machine, a majority vote of the members of the commission shall decide the report, whether favorable or unfavorable to the sale of the said machine.

On motion of Belvel it was determined by the commission that no machine shall be passed upon favorably by the commission until a bond shall have been given by the parties offering the same for sale, fully indemnifying the purchasers against all litigation which may arise as to the legality of the patent thereon, or from other cause.

After the minutes of the current and former meetings had been read and approved, the commission adjourned to meet at the call of the president.

**ROBERT C. WEBB DIED LAST NIGHT**

He Was a Pioneer Business Man of Des Moines and Was Long Engaged in Business Here.

Robert C. Webb, an old and respected citizen of this city, died at 10 o'clock last night, at his late residence, 1334 Twenty-third street. Mr. Webb was apparently in his usual health during the day, and was sitting out on his porch with members of his family until after 9 o'clock. A short time after he retired, Mrs. Webb noticed that her husband was breathing heavily, and she called for assistance. Before a physician could be summoned, Mr. Webb had expired.

R. C. Webb was born in Middle, Tennessee, August 20, 1827. In 1845 he was married to Miss Sarah Case of Wayne county, Indiana. A year later the young couple moved to Wabash county, where Mr. Webb farmed. In 1849 he moved to Somerset, Indiana, and entered the mercantile business. His undertakings in that line were very successful, and he afterwards moved to Kokomo, and then to Peru. From the latter place he moved to Des Moines and engaged in the grocery business. In 1866 the business was enlarged to include the wholesale trade, and the firm was styled R. C. Webb & Son. The wholesale business was built up under Mr. Webb's management until it was the largest in the state. The sales of the firm during the last two years of its existence amounted to over \$1,000,000. In 1885 Mr. Webb disposed of his business to Messrs. Prouty & Pratt, who have since conducted the business.

Mr. Webb's first wife died in 1885. The couple had two children, Constantine L. Webb, who is now engaged in the wholesale grocery business in Tacoma, and Clare E. Webb, who is now the wife of Alvin P. Vinedge, a mine owner of Cook, Montana. Mr. Webb's second wife was Miss Nora Case of Chicago, who succeeds him.

For a number of years Mr. Webb was a director in the State Agricultural society. He has frequently held office in the gift of the people, and has been active in political affairs. While in Indiana, he was twice commissioned justice of the peace. In 1876 he was a delegate to the republican national convention, held at Cincinnati, and two years later he was elected to a seat in the Iowa senate. As a senator he became prominent by securing the release from paying tolls on bridges, making the same public property, supported by taxation. He has aided in the upbuilding of town, county and state, and has identified himself always with the best interests of the community. Mr. Webb was a member of the Methodist Episcopal church.

Says Mrs. Carter Must Pay.

London, July 6.—Two years ago, while in London, Mrs. Carter ordered from a Paris modiste \$2,765 worth of dresses for the original production in New York of "Zaza," payment for which was made in the form of seven checks drawn on the Second National bank of New York.

Later Mrs. Carter went through the New York bankruptcy courts, which wiped out her liability on the checks.

E. D. Marshall of this city, the attorney who recently fought in the liquor cases at Boone, has been retained by the Good Citizenship league of that place to continue the war on the saloons. The saloons there have agreed to stay closed for the present, if none of the injunction suits now pending are pressed and there are no prosecutions for past offenses. It is possible the case in which a decision adverse to the saloon men was given recently will be appealed. This is hardly expected, but it is thought likely steps will be taken to secure a new petition. The anti-saloon forces expect an effort in this direction at any time and are quite confident it will be started about August 1, if not before.

The residence of Fred Stevenson, at 701 Park street, was burglarized during the absence of the family from the city over the Fourth, and money, clothing and silverware valued at \$200 taken. Mr. Stevenson and family left the city for two or three days Tuesday, and he surmises the house was entered Tuesday night. Twenty-five dollars in money left in a dresser, two suits of clothing belonging to Mr. Stevenson, and nearly all the winter clothing owned by Mrs. Stevenson, one dozen silver spoons and one dozen silver knives.
