HON. F. A. GRAY DIES YESTERDAY

Was a Very Prominent Man in the Politics of That Township—Well Known in This City—Mrs Emma F. Cornwall Also Answers the Call.

At 10:10 o'clock last evening, Hon. F. A. J. Gray, residing six miles south-east of Wilton, breathed his last, and answered his first roll call in that higher land. Surrounded by his loved ones this venerable old man said a fond goodbye and quietly folded his arms and crossed the river. Peacefully he passed from this world into the great beyond. For several weeks this good man had been fighting an attack of pneumonia, but the strong constitution could not resist the ravages of this dread disease, and last night he gave up the fight to awake in a better land where no suffering exists. While his death was not unexpected to his family, it came as a shock to them.

Being a man of great character, he was always respected by the people who knew him. He was always ready to do good and so made many friends who are now left to mourn their loss.

F. A. J. Gray was born in West Virginia on February 11, 1832. It was at this place that he spent his boyhood and received his education. On May 31, 1854, he was united in marriage to Miss Adeline Palmer at Wellsburg, W. Va. Shortly after this marriage they moved to Graysville, Pa., where they resided until the latter part of December, 1863.

In September, 1862, Mr. Gray enlisted as a second lieutenant of Company C of the 18th Pennsylvania cavalry. He served with the regiment until July of 1863, when he resigned and went home.

The same year he came to Iowa and settled in Muscatine county, where he made his home ever since. He has resided at his present home six miles southeast of Wilton for many years.
