years as an expert driller.

The 74 foot derrick is completed, just east of P. Grassell's place, and the boiler house and connecting sheds finished. The drillers always set the boiler (this is a 20 horse-power) and connect up.

They will run day and night, hence two sets of men. One tends the engine and sharpens the bits, the other manipulates the drill. It plays mischief with the two inch seagrass or manilla rope to stop operations; it is such a loss of time to take the stretch out of it again. We suppose, tho', they'll stop, Sundays! They will probably get to the bottom in 25 or 30 days.

The first thing to do will be to dig for boiler water, 18 or 24 inches from the spot where the deep hole goes down. So that, while drilling, they are also pumping water into the tank that is to supply the boiler.

The plunging apparatus is very heavy: First, the iron bit 5 1/2 inches, weighing 150 to 200 lbs.; then above that the 3 1/2 auger stem, 30 feet long; next, the iron (steel-faced) jars, too heavy for a man to lift; then the 3 1/2 inch iron sucker probably 16 ft. long; then the rope socket, then the rope. All this will fall 12 to 18 inches at each "chug," at the rate of 30 strokes per minute. Rock has to yield to such humping as that. They will get to drill this week.

In a talk with Mr. Spruill the other day he expressed perfect confidence in getting an abundance of water, and hoped to strike gas also, tho' no one can tell about that. The geologists are utterly helpless. His theory is this:

Far below the lowest found strata of coal, deep in the bowels of the earth, just above the subterranean fires, are strata of coal that the intense heat has reduced to oil. In this process of oil-making, there is vaporization, that is, the production of gas. The force is so great that this gas is pressed thro' all the crevices of the rocks and porous bolls, wherever it can make its way, as it is pushed by a million or billion horse power. If the driller penetrates only solid rock or almost equally compact clays, he finds no gas; but if he gets into porous rock, &c., he is liable to tap gas in one place as in another, as the insidious, subtle agent, sore pressed from below and hahnt, goes everywhere it can, and must penetrate over a vast area of the globe.

Let us hope that the character of the Earth just below us is loose.

Two weeks since fever set in, and he died at 10 o'clock Friday night, Aug. 19th. He was born in Bath co., Ky., Aug. 11, 1814, but when 7 years old, his parents moved to Delaware co., O. He came here at an early day, and located on a farm in Dutch Creek. He was once P. M. at Paris; was co. supervisor in 1869, and a member of the legislature in 1876. He married in Dayton, O., Jane Warrington, in 1850, but she died in Sept., '51. On the 23d Oct., 1859, he married Miss Albright of this county, who bore him six children. Mr. Said was an excellent man, and esteemed by all his neighbors. His public honors attest the appreciation of a still larger area of friends.

Another Dublin letter: Mrs. S. S. Calhoun died very suddenly, the 15th, of heart disease, aged 65 years. She leaves a husband, and had been married 44 years—a woman loved and esteemed by all who knew her. Katie Frank, aged 15, died of consumption and was buried in Valley cemetery Sunday. Hon. Wm.
