In our Des Moines letter appears summary of the findings of the State Insurance Commission's report. Owing to the large number of members of Fraternal Insurance order the recommendation to raise rates all orders to National Fraternal Congress rates is of considerable interest. But three of the orders of Cresco has such rates, the A. O. U. W., the Y. O. W. and the W. O. Most of the members of the Commission are Fraternal organizations. One member belongs to five and the five commissioners in all belong to twelve insurance societies. That all of the commissioners signed this report after listening to insurance experts coming from many states and taking several thousand pages of testimony is positive proof that a thorough investigation of insurance matters will satisfy any one that cheap insurance is undesirable as dear insurance and also more dangerous and risk for the policy holder.

Notice!

The attention of post office patron renting boxes is called to a new order from the Post Office Department dated Oct. 13, 1906, effective Dec. 2, 1906, as follows: "Box rents must be collected at the beginning of each quarter for the entire quarter and no longer.

"Notice of rent due will be placed in each box ten days before the last day of each quarter.

"If a box holder fails to renew his right to his box on or before the last day of a quarter, the box shall then be closed and offered for rent and the mail will be placed in the general delivery."

Patrons will please note that this is ten days earlier than under the old ruling and requires that the box rent business for the entire quarter be closed on the first day of the quarter. C. O. BURGESS, P. M.

Postoffice Department Changes Box Rent Rates.

The following order has been received by P. M. Burgess.

In order to make box rent rates throughout the United States uniform and to provide a definite and satisfactory rate for the collection of postage, the following rates have been adopted and will be strictly adhered to on and after
