Obituary of J. H. Crawford.

James Harvey Crawford was born near Orleans, Orange county, Indiana, August 29, 1830, died at his home in Benton township, Wayne county, Ia., Wednesday, June 24, 1908, aged 77 years, 9 months, 2 days.

He was united in marriage to Mary A. Riley January 8, 1852; moved to Jefferson county, Iowa in March and came to Wayne county in the spring of 1853, where he has always lived, except a term he served as county treasurer of Wayne county and in 1872 he was elected representative in the legislature.

To this union twelve children were born, six of them preceding him to the other world and the remaining children were all present.

Nearly forty years ago he professed Christ as his saviour and united with the Methodist church at Willow Grove. He was a faithful member, a kinder neighbor was never known. The funeral was held at his home June 27, 1908, conducted by Rev. Brown, of Cambria. A large procession of his relatives and friends followed his remains to the Kirby cemetery.

Mr. J. H. Crawford died very
suddenly at his home in Benton
township Wednesday evening
about seven o'clock. He had eat-
en his supper and gone out on the
porch and lain down and passed
away nearly at once without any
apparent pain or any of the family
knowing of the same. Mr. Craw-
ford had been in poor health for
some time but it was not known
that he was worse than usual and
his death was a complete surprise
to his family and friends.

J. H. Crawford was one of the
early settlers of this county and
one of the best known men in the
county. Away back in the '70s
he represented this county in the
Iowa Legislature. He was an
excellent citizen and his death will
be mourned by many friends all
over the county.

At the time this article was

the funeral services will be held
for the reason that word has been
sent to his two daughters living
near Springfield, Mo., and until
now they have not been heard
