PIONEER STATE SENATOR DEAD

Matthew Long, Formerly of Williamsburg Was State Senator Forty Years Ago—Dies in Missouri.

WILLIAMSBURG, May 8.—Hon. Matthew Long, at one time a resident of Williamsburg, died at his home in Marshfield, Mo., at the advanced age of 55 years. He came from Ohio to Williamsburg in 1821 and for many years was one of its most influential citizens. He served as state senator from Iowa county forty years ago and afterwards made his home in Des Moines for several years. He leaves four children, one daughter in Bos-

ton and one in Los Angeles, the oldest son, William, in Marshfield, Mo. and Jacob, who is a resident of Des Moines.
