THE RED RISING.

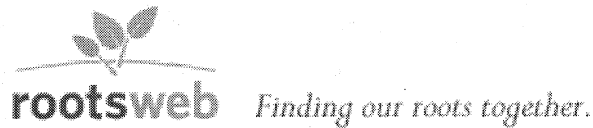
A Twenty-seven Foot Rise Saturday.

FARGO, N. D., April 13.—An inch and a half of water fell during the hours. It is still snowing heavily, the wind 80 miles an hour. The river is rising at the rate of 8 inch hour. Oliver Otis STINCHFIELD/STANCHFIELD was born 1832 in Robbinston (Wayne) ME and died 1893 in Mitchell (Davison)SD. He was the son of Roger STINCHFIELD/STANCHFIELD and Fannie ALLEN.

He married Elfrida WADSWORTH before 1860 in Cedar Rapida Iowa. She was born circa 1835 and died before 1874.

His second marriage was to Caroline Matilda GROVER 09 Sep 1874 in Pentwater (Oceana) MI. Caroline was born 11 Feb 1854 in Woodstock (Carleton) New Brunswick, Canada (?) and died 16 Oct 1944 in Pentwater (Oceana) MI. She was the daughter of James GROVER and Eliza ALLEN.

In 1850 (17 years old) , Oliver was still living with his parents in Robbinston (Washington County) Maine. He was a graduate of the University of Maine Law School, according to Roger Stinchfield'S 1963 The Stinchfield-Stanchfield Family.

Oliver and Elfrida were living in Cedar Rapids Iowa by 1860; possibly sharing a house with a Samuel MARTIN. Oliver's real estate worth was \$600 and he was listed as a lumberman.

He was elected as Sheriff of Linn County in 1862, and by 1870 was a lawyer with 2 servants. According to the History of Linn County Iowa,

O.B. [sic] STANCHFIELD was listed as a state representative in the Iowa Legislature for one term. No date was given.

Elfrida must have died sometime after 1870 and before 1873. They had 8 children together, but only 2 survived childhood. Oliver brought Jessie (born c 1867) and Mortimer (born c 1869) to Ludington, where some cousins (unsure of actual kinship) were living.

"...[Oliver] came to Ludington in 1873, and engaged in lumbering business in partnership with E.A. FOSTER. He was also the district's representative in the state legislature in 1875-1879" (from undated, unnamed newspaper clipping (probably local to Oceana/Mason CO, MI) about Rex STANCHFIELD, one of Oliver O's sons.)

He married Caroline Â"at residence of bride's father by Rev. Joseph B. PRICHARDÂ". Both Oliver and James GROVER are listed as Esq.

By 1880, Oliver was listed as Â"attorney at Law - ThompsonÂ" and they lived on the southwest corner of Harrison and Pere Marquette streets. Oliver was a also a Free Mason.

Caroline Grover and her parents came to Pentwater between 1865 and c 1872 from Woodstock, New Brunswick, Canada. Caroline was a member of the WCTU, and gave music lessons.

It is unclear why the family moved from Michigan to Mitchell, South Dakota. Robert Guy Lee was born there, and Oliver passed away there, as well.

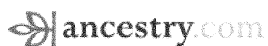

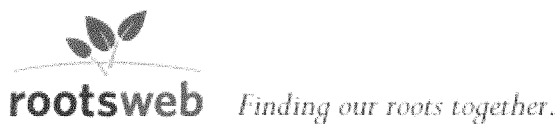

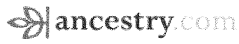
