ELIAB DOUD.

On October 12, 1812, Eliab Doud
was born in Luzerne, (now Bradford)
county, Pennsylvania, and in 1818
moved with his parents to Hamilton
Co., Ohio, and in 1820 to Clark Co.,
and three years later to Licking
Co., same state. In 1837 he went to
Bourbon Co., Kentucky, where he
engaged in school teaching, and in
1843 came to Van Buren Co., Iowa,
where he located on the homestead,
part of which is the site of the town
of Douds, where he died Saturday,
September 30, 1890, lacking 16
days of being 87 years old. He was
married to Miss Mary J. Whitter,
January 7, 1847, who died some
years ago. To them were born
eleven children, all but two or three
still living. Mr. Doud was a man of
splendid mind until afflicted by
disease a few years ago. For a
long time he was Justice of the
Peace of Village township, and in
1865 he was elected state senator,
serving four years, during which
time he was the author of the
famous amendment to a bill regu-
lating railroad tariff, passed by
the legislature, known as the "Doud
Amendment." At the first election
after the enactment of the law es-
tablishing the board of supervisors
as now constituted, he was one of
the candidates, but defeated by a
few votes. Until afflicted by disease
he was a very useful citizen and
was always held in high esteem by
all who knew him. Death came to
him about 10 o'clock last Saturday
and the funeral was held Monday
at the M. E. church at Douds, a
large attendance being present and
Eld. Geo. A. Hendrickson of Keo-
sauqua preaching, after which the
remains were buried in the Mt.
Morial cemetery north of town.

ROBERT McCUTCHEON.

Thursday, Sept 28, 1890, Robert
McCUTCHEON, one of the good men of
the county, as well as one of the first
settlers, died at his home in Wash-
ington township. On the Saturday
previous he was digging potatoes,
near the house, feeling unusually
well for several days previous, and
had carried a sack partly filled to the
celler door as his daughter was
passing out for a bucket of water,
when he felt the sack and in reach-
ing to her that he had wrenched his
neck as he shouldered the sack and
