## A PIONEER GONE.

Another of the Old and Respected Citizens of Linn County Called to His Final Reward—John P. Carbee Dies After a Brief Ill- ness.

In the death of Hon. John P. Carbee, which occurred yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock, Linn county loses one of its early settlers and most honored citizens.

On last Friday morning Mr. Carbee, in company with his two brothers from New Hampshire, who were visiting him, started to visit the World's Fair. But he was taken ill on the way and was obliged to return home on Saturday evening, reaching Springville Sunday morning in a very critical condition, from which he never rallied.

Mr. Carbee settled in Brown township in 1850 and entered 300 acres of govern- ment land located in sections 5 and 8 and had brought it to a high state of improvement, residing upon it until his death.

Mr. Carbee was about 70 years of age having been born in Bath, N. H., May 3, 1823.

He was elected a member of the general assembly of Iowa in 1863 and served two years, he was reelected in 1865 and served until 1867. His re- election is all that is necessary to im- press upon the reader his popularity among his constituents and neighbors.

He was a man of strong connections decided opinions and of unswerving integrity, and was held in great respect and esteem by his friends and acquaint- ances. He leaves a widow and five children all of whom are married except one, the youngest.

The funeral is fixed for 1 o'clock this afternoon.

John P. Carbee was a son of John and Anna Carbee of New Hampshire. Was born on a farm in Bath Grafton County, New Hampshire. Received a common school education and lived with his parents until twenty-one years of age and then worked out on a farm one year. Going to Vermont, he continued to labor by the month till 1850 . During that year he went to Linn County, Iowa, and on May 16th entered 300 acres of government land located in sections 5 and 8 in Brown township.

He was elected a representative in the general assembly of the state of Iowa in 1863 , and re-elected in 1865 serving till 1867. While a member of the assembly he served on many important committees and was also one of the signers of the resolution ratifying the amendment to the constitution of the United States, abolishing slavery.

He held all the offices in the gift of his fellow townsmen , except constable and township clerk. He was a farmer and a republican. He was brought up a Congregationalist but did not unite with any church in Iowa, and died 10-25-1893. Sarah continued to live on the farm.
