EARLY PIONEER GONE.


Hon. L. W. Hart, one of the strong men who helped put lower into the march of progress and guided her childish steps into the path of anti-slavery and republicanism, passed away at his

home in Texas May 17. Leonard Wells Hart was born in Batavia, New York, September 7, 1822. He was educated at Caryvill and Lyma college, New York, and went south to Holly Springs, Miss., in the forties, where he lived and taught school for a number of years. In 1855 he removed to Independence, where he engaged in the practice of law, and served as a member of the state senate during the war of the Rebellion. He was one of the signers of the ratification of the emancipation proclamation issued by Gov. Stone of this state. He married Eleanor Curtis on the 4th day of July, 1855, at Independence, and they lived new ones were placed on the here for about twenty-two years, where their children were born. In 1877 the couple moved to Nebraska, where they resided about three years at Seward, and then to Archer county, Texas, where he has lived since the organization of the county, about twenty-fiveyears. He has been identified with the land interest of the entire northwest part of Taxas, and was widely acquainted with the legal fraternity of the state. He had been a prominent member of the Methodist church for forty years. His death occurred in Archer City, Texas, at his home, May 17, 1905. Had he lived until the 4th of July he would have celebrated his golden wedding day, and had he lived until September 7 his eighty-third He is survived by his wife birthday: and four children: One daughter, Mrs. Lillian Kerr, of Colorado Springs; F. L. Hart, of Victor, Col.; Fred Hart, of Boston, Mass., and Mont Hart, of Archer City, Texas. His widow is a sister of L. J. and Wilbur Curtis, of this city, and Henry Cartis, of Le-Mars.


