 Julia A. Russell was born February 8th, 1840, in Michigan, and, at the age of five years, moved with her parents to Iowa and settled near Keokuk, and came to Jefferson County in 1856. She was married to J. H. McCullough, who was wounded at Jackson, Mississippi, in 1863, and, like many other noble and brave men, gave his life for his country. From this union were born three sons -- one who preceded his father in death, Lewis N., of New Windsor, Colorado, and Frank S. of Ottumwa. In 1867 she was married to W. K. Conder, who with two sons, Charles W. and Harvey H., and two daughters, Mrs. A. D. Morris of Stockport and Mrs. G. F. Lowen of Rome, survive her.....Her death took place November 9th, at the age of sixty-four years, eight months and twenty-two days..... Funeral services were held at the home by Rev. J. Lee and the remains were interred in the cemetery at Glasgow..... See Marriage Records, Vol. 2 for Frank S. McCullough and wife. Heaton's big scrap book. Hamilton McCulloch served in the 17th Iowa and was killed in battle with his commission as a lieutenant in his pocket; brother of Artemisia Meneely and of John T. McCullough; half-brother of Jonathan McCullough.
