Shields was terribly crushed when the machines came together with terrific force and an operation as a last resort has failed to relieve him.

Shields is 19 years old and was born in Butte, Mont., where he lived until recently, and where his father was killed in a mine accident. With his brother, John, aged 21 years, he has been supporting the family, consisting


