TOM SHIELDS DYING FROM INJURY IN AUTO WRECK

Everett, Wash., Aug. 16.—Tom Shields, an employe of Darlinge's drug store, is dying tonight in an Everett hospital as a result of injuries received in a collision of autos. Shields was terribly crushed when the machines came together with terrific force and an operation as a last resort has failed to relieve him.

Shields is 19 years old and was born in Butte, Mont., where he lived until recently, and where his father was killed in a mine accident. With his brother, John, aged 21 years, he has been supporting the family, consisting of his mother and two little girls.

"Square it with mother," were his last words to his brother when he visited him at the hospital after the accident. He wanted the news broken to her gently that he was badly hurt.
