OBITUARY.

DR. ZIBA BROWN was born in Knox county, Ohio, September 21st, 1816; married to Jane Coffey, December 3d, 1837; became a member of the Protestant Methodist church 1832; commenced the study of medicine in Springfield, Ohio, in 1836; was ordained a minister of the Gospel, 1838. Soon afterwards he became identified with the Church of Christ, of which he continued a faithful minister till death.

He was a member of the Sonate of Iowa in 1863 and 1864. Was Chaplain of the 5th Iowa cavalry after the Senate adjourned till the close of the war. He then came to Missouri, remaining there till 1872, when he came to Wilson county, Kansas.

In June last he became pastor of the Christian church in Fredonia. During his pastorate here he had the esteem of all the church and the good will of the citizens.

At 11 a. m. April 1st, 1875, he passed away as quietly as falling to sleep. He was ready and willing to exchange this world for the better land.
