Hon. Daniel Cort, an old and highly
respected citizen of Jackson county, died
at his home in Zwingle very suddenly
Tuesday. He was sitting at his desk
writing when the summons came. He
was born in Westmoreland county, Pa.,
November 1, 1813. He came to Iowa in
1846 and settled on the farm on which he
died. Miss Sarah Brigham became his
wife May 28, 1838. She died about two
years ago. Five children survive. Mr.
Cort was elected to the legislature in
1856 and also in 1864. He was also a
member of the county board of super-
visors for several years.
