THE LATE H. H. WILLIAMS.

WILLIAMS—Died, at the family residence near Eddyville, Mahaska county, Iowa, Feb. 12th, 1890, Hon. H. H. Williams, aged 86 years, 10 months, and 1 day.

Mr. Williams was born in Cumberland county, Kentucky, April 5th, 1813; from there he went to Martinsville, Indiana; from there to Iowa in 1837, and resided in Burlington till the year 1844, moving that year to the home place where he died as above stated. It is needless to say that all these forty-six years he lived in our midst, he was an honest, honorable man, faithful and true in every position he occupied. In the interval between 1844 and 1890 he occupied various official places in which he performed his duties impartially and won the reputation of honesty. Mr. Williams was elected to the eighth general assembly of Iowa and served his full time, and being a life-long democrat his election in a republican county, demonstrates the fact that others outside of his party, entertained good opinions of his fitness for the place. But the place where he was tested most, was in his life at home. No one ever asked a favor of him, if in his power to grant, who was turned away, and the writer hereof knows by personal experience and observation the kind and generous heart he possessed. He and his family knew how to deprive themselves of conveniences to accommodate others, and in years gone by when more called on them than they could lodge in beds, he would say, we have floors, and he was ever willing to share that kind of bed himself to see others in his house made comfortable.

Mr. Williams was married three times; to his first wife in Morgan county, Indiana, who lived but a short time, leaving one child. The second marriage was to Miss Nancy Elliott, who died January 17, 1865, where the family now reside. To their marriage were born five children: Rufus, Henry, Mary, Samuel, and Sarah Ann (deceased). Those living were at the funeral. The third marriage was to Mrs. R. J. Johnson, of Eddyville. Their children are, Thomas J., Fred A., Jack, Anna J., Jessie E., and Sadie the youngest, 15 years old. All the children living were present at their father's funeral.

Arrangements being made, two well selected pieces were sung, which made a good impression upon all within the house. The writer officiated. The funeral was very largely attended. It is well known that Mr. Williams was what the world calls, a materialist, and had instructed that he be buried without ceremony, but his many friends and very intelligent ones, thought perhaps that to lay away so good a man, that all loved so well, would not be the better way, and prepared a burial memorial, gotten up very appropriately by very competent friends, but was not used at the funeral. I being an old and long time acquaint-

At the hour of 3 o'clock the casket containing the remains of Mr. Williams was arranged so that all could take a last look at their dear old neighbor and friend, the family having taken leave before in a room set apart for that purpose. Dear brother, how natural he looked. An acquaintance of thirty-nine years had wrought many changes in us both; but as I looked at that noble, manly form before me, many, many pleasant memories of the past were vividly impressed on my mind. The living know that they must go the way of all the earth, but while we sojourn here, let us adopt the mottoes of two remarkable personages: "As ye would that others should do to you, do you also unto them," the other, "Help for the living and hope for the dead." "So mote it be."

All ready, the procession moved away, and the cemetery being near, the remains were soon at the grave. A few words were spoken by the writer, and all returned to their respective homes: Peace to his ashes, and may all good forces of the All Father bless the bereft family and keep them united heart and hand so they may live in love, peace and harmony.
