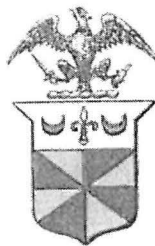

In the Marietta, Ohio *Register*, August, 1874, is an account of the first agricultural society ever organized in Ohio, at Marietta, Feb. 22, 1819; it was also published in a pamphlet of eight pages by Royal Prentice, Marietta, Ohio, 1819.

49. STANTON<sup>6</sup> PRENTICE, son of Stanton and Mary; removed at six years old with his father's family to Marietta, Ohio; and m. there in 1818, Miss Susanna Brookhart. He served in the war of 1812, one year under Gen. Harrison. After marriage he removed to Hockingport, Athens County, Ohio; was in the dry-goods business there till 1831, when he removed to Warsaw, Ill. (then known as Fort Edwards); while here the Black Hawk war broke out, and his family removed into the fort for protection part of the time. In 1835 he located in Rock Island County, Ill.; in 1852, removed to New Boston, Mercer County, Ill., where he resided in 1876, at the good old age of 83. Children:

### ROYAL PRENTISS

Royal Prentiss was the son of Stanton and Susannah (Brookhart) Prentiss and the grandson of Stanton Prentis and Mary (Fowler) Prentiss. Royal's grandfather was a Captain in the Revolutionary War, a wagonmaster in the French Army, and a seaman. He was also believed to have been held prisoner aboard the British ship The Old Jersey.

It is possible that Royal was named after his father's brother, Royal. The elder Royal Prentiss was a pioneer journalist in Ohio who, with another uncle, Genison, established the Marietta Gazette and Register.

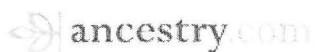

## STANTON PRENTISS

Stanton Prentiss of Mercer County was born about 1793 in Essex, Massachusetts, and died about 1875 in Mercer County, Illinois. His tombstone in New Boston Cemetery tells says he served in the War of 1812 (Sgt.) in Steeds Company, Virginia Militia, but does not contain readable dates.

Stanton was the son of Stanton Prentis who was born abt 1750 in Massachusetts, and Mary (Fowler) Prentis, born abt 1761. His father died 1826 in Marietta, Ohio and mother died 1822 in Ohio. His father was a Captain in the Revolutionary War, a wagonmaster in the French Army, and a seaman. He was to believed to have been held prisoner aboard the British ship The Old Jersey.

Stanton married Susannah "Susan" (Brookhart) in Woods County, Virginia, 11/13/1817. The family was very energetic and traveled about a great deal as they participated actively in community life. Census records list Stanton with different occupations over the years including Druggist and Doctor. Stanton was also apparently musically talented as he sang the Star Spangled Banner when the New Boston Sharpshooters departed for camp during the Civil War.

In the 1820's while settled at Warsaw, in Hancock County in Illinois, which was at the time when Black Hawk was making his raids up and down the Mississippi River, the family often had to leave their farm, in order to flee to the safety of Fort Edwards from the Indians. About 1833 they moved to Rock Island County, Illinois, where they became early settlers in the future Drury Township. (Stanton & Susan's daughter, Nancy, married Charles Drury, who's family is the namesake of Drury Township. They were married on 5/1/1838, in Rock Island County and according to the History of Mercer County, Illinois, 1882, she died just 11 months later.)

On 7/2/1839, Stanton purchased land just



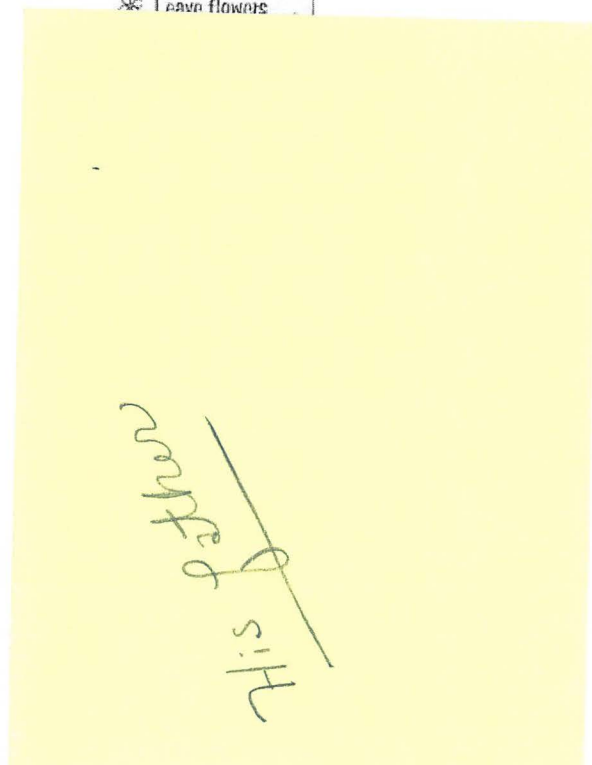

along the Mississippi River in future Eliza Township, Mercer County, Illinois located in the Bay Island, which was a hunting and fishing area that the citizens of New Boston and Eliza Township considered their own private preserve. The 1882 History states that Stanton, Jr. in 1882 owned 1900 acres of land on Bay Island, all in one body and under fence, forming the largest pasture in the county, and the largest body owned by any one person.

Stanton, also purchased additional land along the River, in the SE Section of New Boston Township, these extensive holdings along the Mississippi River in New Boston became known as "Prentiss Addition". The Prentiss family also owned much land in town as well as several businesses. Stanton at one time worked as a Druggist in a Drug Store he co-owned with his son Stanton V. Prentiss.

Some of the Prentiss "Mansions" still stand in New Boston to date and are listed on The Registry of Historic Homes. Prentiss became a very wealthy and prestigious Family name that left their mark all over Mercer County.

After the death of Susan, Stanton married a widow on 8/26/1854 by the name of Mrs. Martha Beach.

### SUSANNAH "SUSAN" (BROOKHART) PRENTISS

Susannah Brookhart was married to Stanton Prentiss, son of Stanton Prentis and Mary (Fowler) Prentis of Massachusetts. They were married in Woods County, Virginia, on 11/13/1817.

### CHILDREN OF SUSAN & STANTON PRENTISS:

- \* Daughter Nancy, born ? in Miegs County, Ohio. Nancy married Charles Drury, 5/1/1838 in Rock Island County. She died just 11 months later, probably in childbirth.
- \* Son Royal, born abt 1824 in Miegs County, Ohio & died 2/19/1867 in Mercer County, Illinois. He is buried in the New Boston Cemetery.
- \* Son Stanton Valentine, born 5/10/1826 in Miegs County, Ohio, and died 3/18/1899 in Mercer County, Illinois. Stanton V. married Hannah Elizabeth Creviston on 5/25/1865. Both are buried in the New Boston Cemetery.
- \* Daughter Eliza, born abt 1828 in Miegs County, Ohio. Eliza married Cyrus H. Maxfield, 9/14/1851 in Rock Island, County. They moved to New Boston Township in Mercer County where they raised horses and livestock.
- \* Daughter Sarah "Sally", born 2/18/1833 in Mercer County, Illinois. Sarah married Job E. Willits 6/8/1854. She died 4/21/1857 in Mercer County. Both are buried in the New Boston cemetery.
- \* There may have been more children of Stanton and Susannah that have not been able to be identified yet.

The family moved several times over the years from Virginia to Ohio to Indiana to Illinois. They moved to New Boston Township in Mercer County, Illinois about 1852, just before Susan's death.

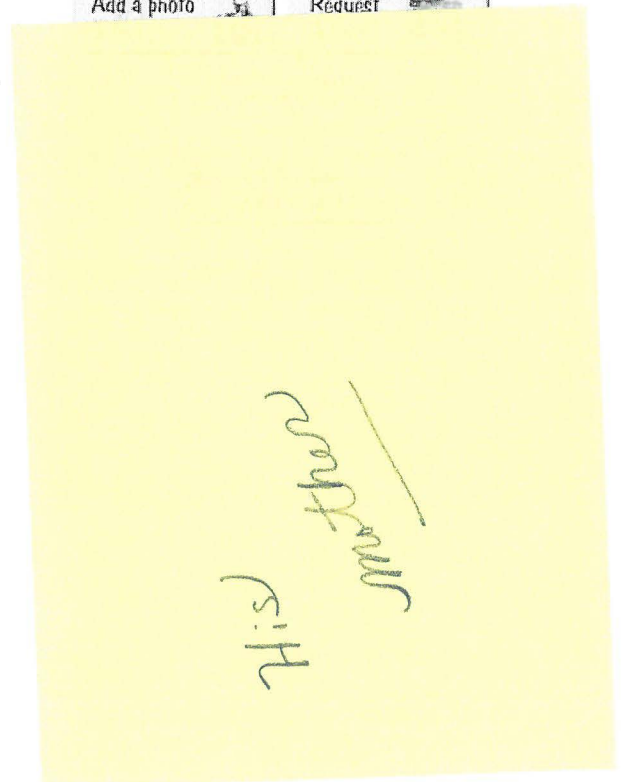

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
