DEATH OF S. G. FINNEY.

One of the Oldest Residents of Wap-
ello County Passes Away.

[From Eldar's Daily.]

Last evening at 7:30 o'clock at his
late residence, one and one-quarter
miles south of Blakesburg, occurred
the death of S. G. Finney, aged eighty-
four years. Mr. Finney was well
known throughout the county, being
one of its oldest settlers having re-
sided near Blakesburg for over forty
years. He leaves a family of eight
children, his wife having been killed
in a railroad wreck near Highland
Center about twelve years ago. Mrs.
O. L. Webb, who resides east of Ot-
tumwa, Mrs. Anna Denny of Lincoln,
Neb., and Earnest Finney of Golden
City, Mo., children of the deceased,
were at his bedside at the time of his
death. The funeral was held from the
family residence this afternoon at 2
o'clock and the interment made in the
Blakesburg cemetery.
