## Death of an Old Citizen.

REV. A. J. KIRKPATRICK died at his residence in this city Wednesday evening July 2, 1884, at 5 o'clock. He had been in bad health for some time, and several times during the past year he was reduced to Death's door and then rallied so far as to get around again. He was taken worse some two weeks ago and continued to sink until his death.

A. J. Kirkpatrick was born in Highland Co., Ohio, Nov. 8, 1814, and lacked but a few months of the allotted three score and ten years. At the age of 15 he went to Indiana where he became a member of the M. E. Church; came to Iowa in 1838 and in 1851 entered the Iowa Conference as a travelling preacher. At Brighton he inaugurated a great revival that resulted in the building of our present M. E. church and parsonage. In 1854 he married Nancy Nicholson who survives him. They have had fourteen children, five of whom survive. He served through the late war as a chaplain, and it was there that he contracted the disease that has finally carried him off. He was drawing a pension of \$15 per month, which was about to be increased to \$24.

The funeral occurred Thursday at 2:30. Services held in the M. E. church, conducted by Rev. Bishop.
