Van Buren Co. Cems have no N. Bakers.

History of Marion Co. 1881 lists A. Baker, blacksmith, born Ohio, who moved from Michigan to Red Rock in 1853, whose father was Nathan, also a blacksmith.

LeeCo. Grantors Index for 1853 to 1871 lists no N. or Nathan Baker.

GAR records show a Nathan Baker, b. 1843, who served in Co. F 98th Ohio, and came to Jefferson Co later, d. 1933 at age 90.
