

Death of Robert P. Wilson.

At the old homestead in Lincoln township, Appanoose county. Iowa, on the 9th day of April, 1896, Robert P. Wilson breathed his last as a result of old age accompanied with an aggravated form of erysipelas of the head and face. He was taken with a chill Saturday which so shocked his system that he was not fully conscious for any length of time, when death relieved him of his suffering the following Thursday at 7:40 o'clock. Thus has passed away one of the old pioneers of the state and one of its early law-makers, having lived ln Iowa before it became a state, in all nearly sixty years. He was born in Cable county, Va., now West Va., in 1813, and had he lived till the 11th day of July, he would have been 83 years old. He came with his father to Ill. when a boy and settled in Vermillion county. When the Black Hawk war broke out he volunteered and served one month, the full time for which he had enlisted.

He next went to Wisconsin with a surveying party and afterward worked in the lead mines and smelters, and also freighted with an ox team, to Galena, Ill., Dodgeville and Prairie du Chien.

He was personally acquainted with Gen Henry Dodge and Isaac P. Walker the first two U. S. senators of Wisconsin, and drove an ox team with a son of the former, A. C. Dodge, who, after had the honor of being with Geo. W. Jones, the first U. S. senator of Iowa, all of whom are now dead with the exception of the latter, who was living at Dubuque the last time the writer heard of him, in good health though he must be up in ninety.

If this should prove correct the men who are figuring on buying wheat at 55c are apt to be disappointed. The price may run up to 80 or 85 cents.




