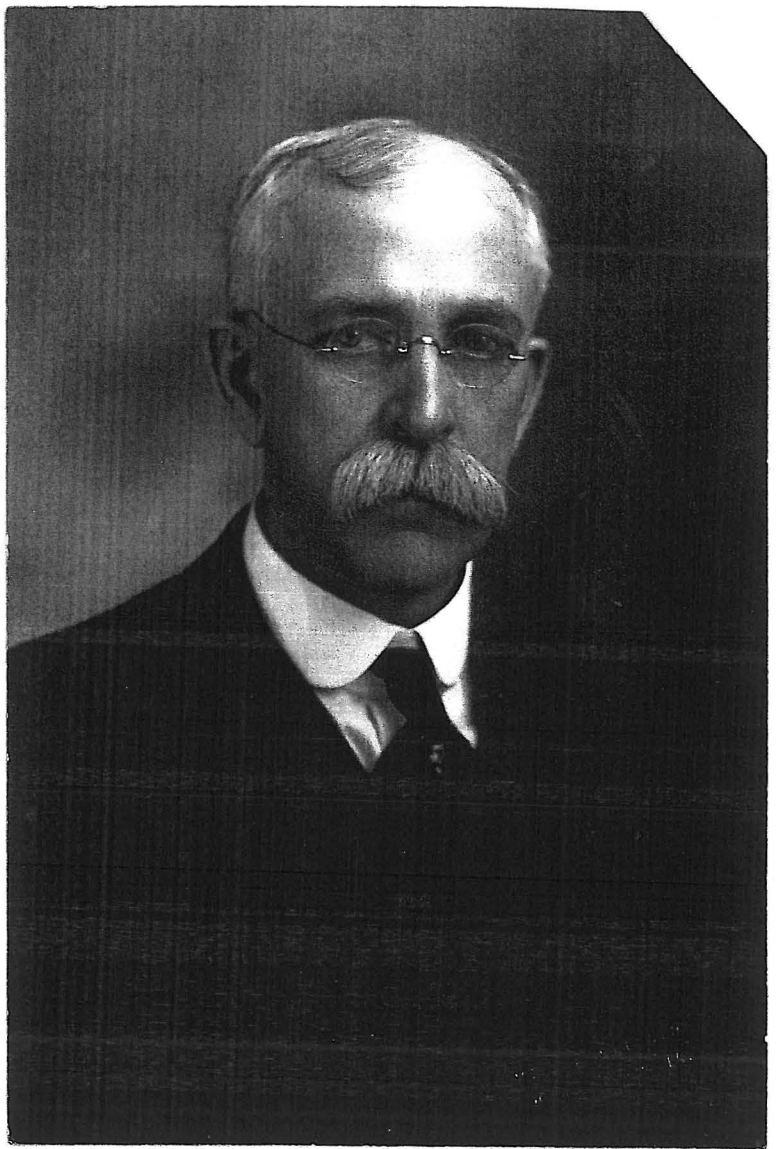

survives him. Funeral services
were held at the Congregational
church in Shenandoah Monday aft-

the service at the Farragut ce-
metery.

Wm. C. Scott Was Former Representative

William C. Scott, 75, died shortly before six o'clock Saturday morning at the Hand Hospital, where he had been for a short time.

Mr. Scott recently moved here from Farragut where he had resided for many years and was in the mercantile business for twenty-eight years.

He was born May 1, 1864, at Sterling, Ill., and moved with his parents to Fremont County in 1877.

He served as clerk of his township for sixteen years; township committeeman 12 years; secretary to the county central committee two years. He was elected representative from Fremont County in 1920 and re-elected in 1922.

Mr. Scott was a member of the Masonic Lodge at Farragut, and of the Congregational Church, but recently transferred his church membership to the Congregational Church in Shenandoah.

Mr. Scott was married February 26, 1888, to Cordelia Simmerman of Farragut, Iowa, who survives him.

Funeral services are being held this afternoon at two o'clock at the First Congregational church, conducted by the pastor, Rev. Allen Keedy.

The Masonic lodge of Farragut will conduct their services at the Farragut cemetery.

Mr. Scott, a republican, served as representative from Fremont County in the state legislature during the thirty-ninth and fortieth general assemblies and for one extra session, during the years 1921 to 1924. He was succeeded by A. D. Latimer (R) now of Shenandoah.

Mr. and Mrs. Scott moved to Shenandoah two weeks ago and joined the Congregational church here.

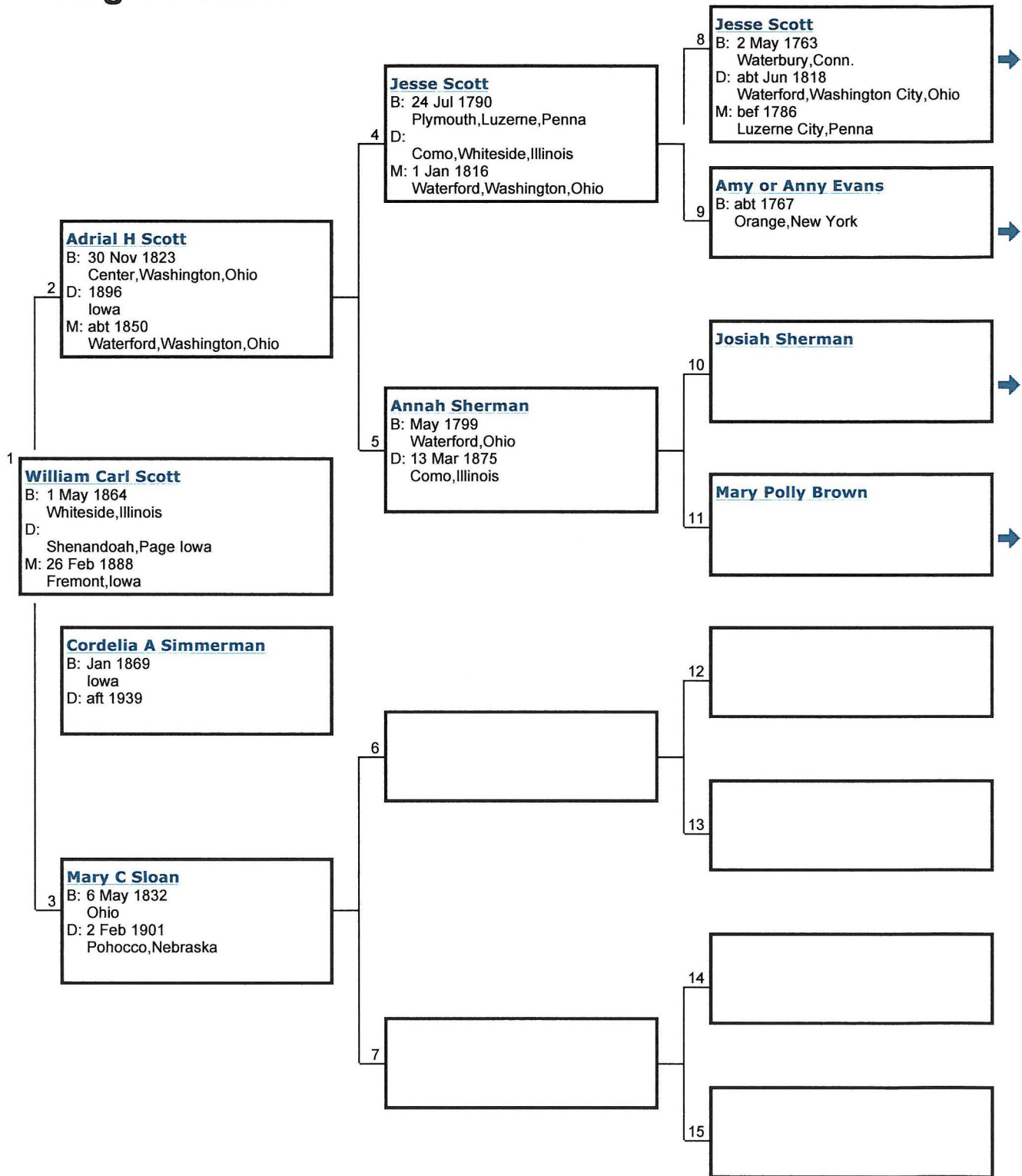
About FamilySearch Pedigree Resource File
