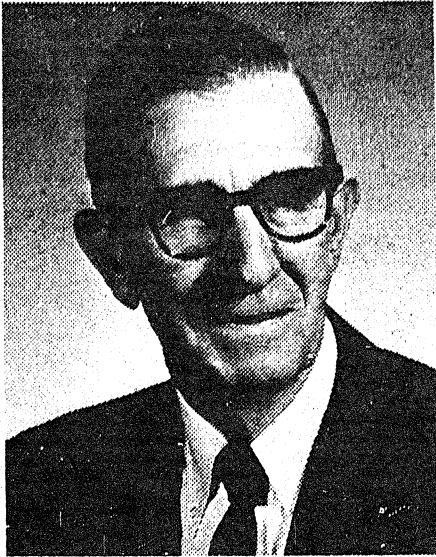

Harry Weichman dies

NEW HALL—Harry E. Weichman, 86,
 retired farmer and real estate broker, and
 a lifelong resident of Newhall, died
 Monday at the Virginia Gay Hospital in
 Vinton.

He was born April 28, 1892 on a farm
 near Newhall, a son of Pauline and Frank
 Weichman. He was married Sept. 30, 1914
 to Elizabeth Meyer, who preceded him in
 death Feb. 15, 1964. He married Marvel
 Hodge Pepmeyer on Jan. 5, 1970.

He graduated from Atkins High School
 in 1909 and attended Cedar Rapids
 Business College. He served six years as
 director of Newhall Consolidated Schools,
 was a charter member of the Benton
 County Farm Bureau, and was active in
 many community organizations and
 projects. He was state representative for
 Benton County from 1937-1950 and served
 as Republican floor leader in 1949-1950. He
 was state senator for Benton and Tama
 Counties from 1951-1954. He was a member
 of St. John Lutheran Church in Newhall.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by
 two sons, Herbert F. and David E. of
 Newhall; one brother; Victor D. of
 Newhall; two sisters, Irene Kelly of Cedar
 Rapids and Madeline Gluesing of Newhall;
 three grandchildren; and five great-
 grandchildren. He was preceded in death
 by one brother.

The funeral will be at 10:30 a.m.
 Thursday at St. John Lutheran Church,
 with burial in Cedar Memorial Cemetery
 in Cedar Rapids.

HARRY E. WEICHMAN

MR. PRESIDENT: Your committee appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Harry E. Weichman begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Harry E. Weichman was born on a farm near Newhall, Benton County, Iowa on April 28, 1892. He attended business college in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and on September 30, 1914 was married to Elizabeth Meyer, who preceded him in death. Mr. Weichman married Marvel Hodge Pepmeyer on January 5, 1970.

A lifelong resident of Newhall, Harry Weichman was a farmer and real estate broker. For a period of six years he served as the director of Newhall Consolidated Schools, and was a charter member of the Benton County Farm Bureau.

Mr. Weichman was active in numerous community organizations and projects. He was the president of the local Chamber of Commerce, president of the Newhall Parent-Teacher Association, chairman of the regional U.S.O. drive, member of the County Fair Board, school director and member of the St. John Lutheran Church in Newhall.

Mr. Weichman was elected to the Iowa House of Representatives in 1937 and served as a member of that body until 1954.

Harry Weichman died at the age of 86 on June 5, 1978. In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons, Herbert F. and David E. of Newhall; a brother, Victor D. of Newhall; two sisters, Irene Kelly of Cedar Rapids and Madeline Gluesing of Newhall; three grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly of Iowa, That in the passing of the Honorable Harry E. Weichman, the state has lost an honored citizen and a faithful and useful public servant; and that the Senate, by this Resolution, expresses its appreciation for his service to his community, state and nation and tenders its sympathy and sincerest regard to the members of his family; and

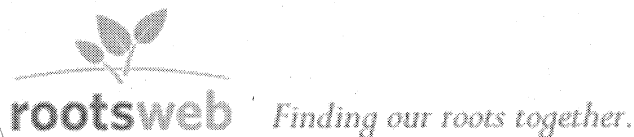
