<u>House File 98</u>, by B. Hansen, a bill for an act relating to a long-term care insurance tax credit under the individual income tax and including a retroactive applicability date provision.

Read first time and referred to committee on ways and means.

<u>House File 99</u>, by Lalk, a bill for an act relating to the recycling property exemption from property tax and including an applicability date.

Read first time and referred to committee on ways and means.

<u>House File 100</u>, by Smith, a bill for an act increasing the penalty for violating the requirements for securing a child under six years of age during transit in a motor vehicle.

Read first time and referred to committee on transportation.

House File 101, by Murphy, a bill for an act relating to the development and implementation of a citizenship grade by the board of directors of a school district.

Read first time and referred to committee on education.

House File 102, by B. Hansen, a bill for an act relating to the residency requirements for city civil service employees.
