Thirty-sixth Calendar Day - Twenty-fifth Session Day

Hall of the House of Representatives Des Moines, Iowa, Monday, February 17, 2003

The House met pursuant to adjournment at 1:10 p.m., Speaker Rants in the chair.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Paul Schaedig, pastor of Bethel Lutheran Church, Parkersburg. He was the guest of Representative Dix of Butler County.

The Journal of Friday, February 14, 2003 was approved.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

They were the guests of Representatives Elgin and Dandekar of Linn County.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

<u>House File 207</u>, by Greimann and Ford, a bill for an act relating to the private sale or transfer of firearms between unlicensed persons and providing penalties.

Read first time and referred to committee on **public safety**.

<u>House File 208</u>, by Drake, a bill an act authorizing the issuance by counties of general obligation bonds without an election for capital improvement projects.

Read first time and referred to committee on local government.

<u>House File 209</u>, by Tymeson, a bill for an act relating to the repeal of the authorization to impose a local sales and services tax for school infrastructure purposes and providing an effective date.

Read first time and referred to committee on education.

<u>House File 210</u>, by Mertz, a bill for an act providing for exceptions to municipal tort liability for claims arising from bicycling or scootering on public property.

Read first time and referred to committee on judiciary.

House File 211, by committee on government oversight, a bill for an act relating to government efficiency by providing for the delivery of administrative services to state government, establishment of common state services regional boundaries, revising medical assistance program eligibility and benefits provisions, improving coordination of veterans benefits eligibility determinations, requiring a comprehensive study of the state mental health institutes, and revising requirements involving the judicial district departments of correctional services, and providing effective dates.

Read first time and referred to committee on state government.

House File 212, by Tymeson and Hoffman, a bill for an act relating to property tax relief and school infrastructure purposes by increasing the state sales tax and distributing certain state sales tax revenues to school districts for property tax relief or school infrastructure purposes if approved by a vote of the electorate, providing a penalty, and including an effective date.

Read first time and referred to committee on education.

House File 213, by Huser and Jacobs, a bill for an act creating a housing trust fund and making an appropriation.

Read first time and referred to committee on economic growth.

House File 214, by Shoultz and Berry, a bill for an act relating to law enforcement stops and searches by establishing a central repository in the department of public safety for the purpose of collecting and disseminating information about motor vehicle stops, and providing that every law enforcement agency adopt a written policy prohibiting stops and searches which constitute a violation of the civil rights of the person.

Read first time and referred to committee on public safety.

<u>House File 215</u>, by committee on commerce, regulation and labor, a bill for an act eliminating certain public disclosure requirements by state banks.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.
