Allowing a modified criminal penalty for certain thefts from retailers.

H.S.B. 573 Education

Relating to the school calendar and start date.

H.S.B. 574 State Government

Relating to public retirement systems, including the public safety peace officers' retirement, accident, and disability system, the Iowa public employees' retirement system, and the statewide fire and police retirement system, and providing effective and retroactive applicability dates.

H.S.B. 575 Natural Resources

Relating to the regulation of vessels by increasing certain vessel registration fees, regulating the operation of certain vessels by minors, providing for increased inspections of certain vessels, providing for pilot and engineer licensing fees, and appropriating the moneys collected to the state fish and game protection fund.

H.S.B. 576 Judiciary

Relating to raising an ineffective assistance of counsel claim against an attorney in a criminal case on appeal.

H.S.B. 577 Judiciary

Relating to the uniform limited partnership Act and providing a penalty and effective dates.

H.S.B. 578 State Government

Providing for the sale of Iowa communications network assets, providing for related technical and substantive changes, and providing an effective date.

H.S.B. 579 State Government

Relating to the filing of statements of organization or dissolution by a political or candidate's committee, and regulating campaign and other contributions.

H.S.B. 580 State Government

Relating to the operation, reporting, and dissolution of committees, reporting requirements for special and other elections, the placement of attribution statements in political materials, and the size and placement of political signs.

H.S.B. 581 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Governing the regulation of elevators and other conveyances and providing penalties.

H.S.B. 582 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to the registration and titling of wrecked or salvage travel trailers and fifth-wheel travel trailers.

H.S.B. 583 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to municipal utilities that provide local exchange services, including nonsubscriber costs, the confidentiality and audits of certain accounting records, and exemption from sales and use taxes.

H.S.B. 584 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to municipal utilities that provide telecommunications services, including the examination and confidentiality of certain accounting records and provision of property tax exemptions.

H.S.B. 585 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

To permit additional fees for residential real estate loans.

H.S.B. 586 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to the temporary authority of a public utility to place certain rates into effect, and making related changes.

H.S.B. 587 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

To require delayed deposit services businesses to disclose annual percentage rates.

H.S.B. 588 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to rules of the Iowa utilities board regarding rate regulation proceedings.

H.S.B. 589 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to consideration of costs and revenues by the utilities board in rate regulatory proceeding, and making related changes.

H.S.B. 590 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to industry standards for boilers, directing the labor commissioner to adopt emergency rules when the industry standards are supplemented, and providing an effective date.

H.S.B. 591 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to the regulation of attorney fees in workers' compensation cases.

H.S.B 592 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Concerning regulatory and statutory requirements relating to liability reform.

H.S.B. 593 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to certain notice requirements for cooperative associations retaining abandoned property.

H.S.B 594 Commerce, Regulation and Labor

Relating to cemeteries and cemetery regulation; establishing requirements for interment rights agreements and reporting; establishing and appropriating fees; and providing administration and enforcement procedures and penalties.
