JOURNAL OF THE HOUSE

Fiftieth Calendar Day - Thirty-third Session Day

Hall of the House of Representatives Des Moines, Iowa, Monday, March 1, 2004

The House met pursuant to adjournment at 12:58 p.m., Speaker Rants in the chair.

Prayer was offered by Reverend David A. Feltman, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, Fort Dodge. He was the guest of Representative Helen Miller from Webster County.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Speaker Rants.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

<u>House File 2400</u>, by Rants, a bill for an act relating to the parties to contracts for services entered into by state departments, institutions, and agencies, and their representatives, and providing for damages.

Read first time and referred to committee on state government.

<u>House File 2401</u>, by committee on environmental protection, a bill for an act relating to the comprehensive petroleum underground storage tank fund.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.

<u>House File 2402</u>, by committee on state government, a bill for an act restricting executive branch authority to transfer appropriations between departments.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.

<u>House File 2403</u>, by committee on local government, a bill for an act providing for the administration of fairs, providing for the allocation of moneys, and providing for an effective date.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.

House File 2404, by committee on state government, a bill for an act relating to certain alternative forms of county and city government by providing for county redistricting and representation, charter commission administration, application of various statutory requirements, the manner in which a charter may be proposed and adopted, amendment of a charter, the organization of the governing body, and inclusions in a charter, making technical changes relating to the administration and authority of a city-county consolidated government and a community commonwealth, making changes related to multicounty consolidation, and including effective and retroactive applicability date provisions.

Read first time and placed on the calendar.

<u>House File 2405</u>, by Swaim, a bill for an act relating to dangerous animals, including by regulating the possession of those animals, requiring registration of the animals, and providing penalties.

Read first time and referred to committee on **natural resources**.

<u>House File 2406</u>, by Mertz, Whitaker and Dolecheck, a bill for an act relating to the keeping of farm deer.

Read first time and referred to committee on agriculture.

<u>House File 2407</u>, by Hogg, a bill for an act relating to suspended sentences of incarceration for third or subsequent operating-while-intoxicated motor vehicle offenses.

Read first time and referred to committee on judiciary.

<u>House File 2408</u>, by Paulsen, a bill for an act relating to the management of manure, excreta, or other commonly associated wastes of dogs kept by commercial breeders, and providing penalties.

Read first time and referred to committee on agriculture.

<u>House File 2409</u>, by committee on commerce, regulation and labor, a bill for an act providing for the regulation of securities, providing for fees and penalties, and providing an effective date.

Read first time and referred to committee on ways and means.
