HOUSE STUDY BILL COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENT

H.S.B. 724 Ways and Means

Relating to state budgetary matters and revenue enhancements by making and revising certain appropriations, phasing out the sales tax on residential utilities, requiring combined corporate returns of unitary business, adjusting cigarette and tobacco products tax rates, expanding the services subject to sales and use taxes and adjusting the sales and use tax rates, increasing the appropriation for family farm tax credits and repealing the agricultural land tax credits, revising the tax rates for gambling game establishments, altering the source of moneys to the grow Iowa values fund, providing for military pay differential, establishing state percent of growth for school aid, providing an early employment separation incentive program, providing a standing appropriation for printing cigarette tax stamps, and including effective and retroactive applicability date provisions.
