Providing for the extension of a reduction in the foundation property tax levy for reorganized or dissolved districts, and the extension of the period during which supplementary weighting may be received as a reorganization incentive by school districts, and providing an effective date.

**H.S.B. 727 Ways and Means**

Relating to taxation by making changes relating to property tax, income tax, city and county budgets, creating an implementation task force and providing an appropriation, and providing effective and applicability dates.

**H.S.B. 728 Local Government**
