[House File 2708](#), a bill for an act concerning the veterans trust fund by providing for the minimum balance necessary in order to expend funds from the veterans trust fund and providing for an annual report concerning the fund, was taken up for consideration.

35 Sec. \_\_. IMPLEMENTATION. The checkoff created in  
36 this Act shall be eligible for placement on the

 38 tax year commencing January 1, 2006.  
 39 Sec. \_\_\_. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. The section  
 40 of this Act enacting section 422.12G applies  
 41 retroactively to the tax year commencing January 1,  
 42 2006."

 44 words "trust fund" the following: ", providing an  
 45 individual income tax checkoff for the fund,".  
 46 3. Title page, line 4, by inserting after the
