INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

<u>House File 2076</u>, by Rinker, a bill for an act relating to supplemental aid and modified supplemental amounts for certain school districts relating to open enrollment and including effective date and applicability provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on Education.

House File 2077, by Collins and Harris, a bill for an act relating to higher education, including requiring the cancellation of the recognition or registration of public institution of higher education student organizations that support or endorse terrorism or certain specified terrorist organizations, prohibiting students enrolled in institutions of higher education who support or endorse terrorism or certain specified terrorist organizations from receiving certain specified forms of financial aid, modifying the duties of the attorney general, and including effective date provisions.

House File 2078, by Latham, a bill for an act relating to civil liability of sports officials, providing criminal penalties for assault of

sports officials, and including effective date and applicability provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on Judiciary.

<u>House File 2079</u>, by Lohse, Andrews, and Gustoff, a bill for an act relating to the use of county funds by ecclesiastical and sectarian institutions.

Read first time and referred to committee on Local Government.

<u>House File 2080</u>, by A. Meyer, a bill for an act relating to firearms by limiting civil liability of federal firearms licensees who enter into voluntary firearm hold agreements with individuals.

Read first time and referred to committee on Public Safety.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE RESOLUTION 101

Windschitl of Harrison called up for consideration <u>House</u> <u>Resolution 101</u>, a resolution affirming the State of Iowa's support for the State of Israel and condemning the Hamas attack on Israel on October 7, 2023.

Wills of Dickinson moved the adoption of <u>House Resolution 101</u>.
