INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

House File 2081, by Jones, a bill for an act modifying provisions related to the curriculum provided to students enrolled in grades nine through twelve by allowing instruction related to agriculture to meet a portion of the unit requirements related to science.

<u>House File 2082</u>, by Shipley, a bill for an act relating to gender identity and disability under the Iowa civil rights Act.

House File 2083, by Jones, a bill for an act authorizing a county attorney to be issued a professional permit to carry weapons.
