<u>House File 2594</u>, a bill for an act establishing the criminal offense of organized retail theft, providing penalties, and including effective date provisions.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

House File 2671, by committee on Appropriations, a bill for an act relating to aid, processes, services, and support staff for children in, adopted from, or in need of foster care, including the establishment of a legal representation for juvenile cases interim study committee, and making appropriations.

<u>House File 2672</u>, by committee on Ways and Means, a bill for an act relating to forest and fruit-tree reservation tax exemptions, including county participation and minimum size requirements for forest reservations.

Read first time and placed on the Ways and Means calendar.

SENATE MESSAGE CONSIDERED

<u>Senate File 2405</u>, by committee on Appropriations, a bill for an act modifying provisions related to the distribution formula for general state financial aid to community colleges and including applicability provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on Appropriations.
