#### SENATE AMENDMENT CONSIDERED House Concurred

Gehlbach of Dallas called up for consideration <u>House File 2615</u>, a bill for an act relating to education, including by requiring community colleges to publish information related to graduates, requiring school districts to provide students enrolled in grades eleven and twelve with information related to graduates of community colleges and the average income and student debt of graduates of institutions of higher education governed by the state board of regents, and modifying provisions related to supplementary weighting, amended by the Senate, and moved that the House concur in the Senate amendment <u>H-8261</u>.

The motion prevailed and the House concurred in the Senate amendment  $\underline{H-8261}$ .

Gehlbach of Dallas moved that the bill, as amended by the Senate and concurred in by the House, be read a last time now and placed upon its passage which motion prevailed and the bill was read a last time.
