Mr. Speaker: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the Senate has on April 10, 2024, adopted the following resolution in which the concurrence of the Senate was asked:

<u>House Joint Resolution 2006</u>, a joint resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa relating to requirements for certain state tax law changes.

Also: That the Senate has on April 10, 2024, amended and passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

<u>House File 664</u>, a bill for an act exempting certain leases or rentals between affiliates from the sales and use tax and from the fee for new vehicle registration, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions.

<u>House File 2586</u>, a bill for an act relating to school security, including by establishing the school security personnel grant program within the department of education and authorizing school employees to be issued professional permits to carry weapons.
