MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

The following messages were received from the Senate:

Mr. Speaker: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the Senate has on April 11, 2024, amended and passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

<u>House File 35</u>, a bill for an act relating to private land available for public use for recreational purposes.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the Senate was asked:

<u>House File 2260</u>, a bill for an act relating to the practices of performing rights societies.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, amended and passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

<u>House File 2464</u>, a bill for an act relating to government records of firearms, and payment card transactions involving firearms and ammunition, and providing civil penalties.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the Senate was asked:

<u>House File 2515</u>, a bill for an act relating to the licensure of marital and family therapists, mental health counselors, and social workers, and including effective date provisions.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the Senate was asked:

<u>House File 2556</u>, a bill for an act relating to damages against participants in firearms regulation violations by political subdivisions, and including effective date provisions.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, amended and passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

<u>House File 2661</u>, a bill for an act relating to public safety personnel by modifying the retirement benefits of sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, restricting bail for murder in the first degree or felonious assaults committed upon public safety personnel, and providing for a tax credit for moving expenses available against the individual income tax for new public safety personnel moving to the state, and including retroactive applicability provisions.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the Senate was asked:

<u>House File 2680</u>, a bill for an act relating to public safety personnel retirement systems, the taxation of surviving spouse pension benefits, and including retroactive applicability provisions.

Also: That the Senate has on April 11, 2024, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

<u>Senate File 2422</u>, a bill for an act relating to transportation and other infrastructurerelated appropriations to the department of transportation, including allocation and use of moneys from the road use tax fund and the primary road fund.
