[H.S.B. 44](#) Education

Relating to career education, including middle school career exploration and industry-recognized credential seals and certificates for high school students.

[H.S.B. 45](#) Education

Requiring the director of the department of education to develop and administer a purple star school initiative.

[H.S.B. 46](#) Education

Relating to mandatory reporting to the board of educational examiners of licensed school employees who engage in grooming behavior toward students.

H.S.B. 47 Education

Relating to school safety by requiring the creation of threat assessment teams and authorizing information sharing between certain governmental agencies.

H.S.B. 48 Education

Providing for an annual authorization fee to be collected by the college student aid commission from certain postsecondary educational institutions not subject to registration with the commission.

H.S.B. 49 Judiciary

Relating to the place of trial for certain criminal offenses.
