**H.S.B. 50 Higher Education**

Providing for a review by the state board of regents of academic programs offered at regents institutions.

**H.S.B. 51 Higher Education**

Relating to tuition, degree programs, employment, and related matters pertaining to students enrolled at regents institutions.

**H.S.B. 52 Higher Education**

Establishing a school of intellectual freedom at the university of Iowa.

**H.S.B. 53 Higher Education**

Prohibiting certain requirements for students and faculty at regents institutions relating to diversity, equity, inclusion, and critical race theory and including applicability provisions.

**H.S.B. 54 Higher Education**

Requiring reporting by regents institutions of funding from certain foreign sources and including effective date provisions.

**H.S.B. 55 Higher Education**

Requiring regents institutions to make certain course syllabus information available to the public online and including effective date provisions.

**H.S.B. 56 Higher Education**

Establishing completion of a course on American history and civil government as a requirement for the completion of a baccalaureate degree program at a public institution of higher education.

**H.S.B. 57 Higher Education**

Relating to accreditation of postsecondary educational institutions, prohibiting adverse action by accrediting agencies against certain postsecondary educational institutions for compliance with state law, providing remedies, and including effective date provisions.

**H.S.B. 58 Higher Education**

Providing for the ethical use of research animals.

**H.S.B. 59 Higher Education**

Providing for public availability of certain financial information of regents institutions and including effective date provisions.

**H.S.B. 60 Higher Education**

Prohibiting private institutions of higher education that participate in the Iowa tuition grant program from establishing diversity, equity, and inclusion offices.

**H.S.B. 61 Higher Education**

Prohibiting community colleges from establishing diversity, equity, and inclusion offices and engaging in certain other activities relating to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

**[H.S.B. 62](#) Higher Education**

Requiring that a portion of funds for the Iowa tuition grant be awarded to students pursuing majors leading to high-wage and high-demand jobs and including effective date provisions.

**[H.S.B. 63](#) Higher Education**

Providing for general education requirements for undergraduate students at regents institutions and including applicability provisions.

**[H.S.B. 64](#) Transportation**

Relating to the use of an electronic device in a voice-activated or hands-free mode while driving, providing penalties, and making penalties applicable.

**[H.S.B. 65](#) Commerce**

Relating to rate-regulated utilities, including telecommunications and electronic transmission services.

Relating to strict liability for a person in control of hazardous substances.
