Mr. Speaker: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the Senate has on April 28, 2025, amended and passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the House is asked:

[House File 395](#), a bill for an act relating to approved courses of instruction for school bus drivers.

Also: That the Senate has on April 28, 2025, passed the following bill in which the concurrence of the Senate was asked:

[House File 835](#), a bill for an act relating to school personnel training, including by implementing provisions related to emergency care planning, authorizations for assisting, and limitations of liability concerning students with epilepsy or seizure disorder, and requiring the department of education to convene a health care-related training for school personnel work group.

STUDY BILL COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS

[H.S.B. 334](#) Appropriations

Relating to and making appropriations from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund and technology reinvestment fund, providing for related matters including county payment for district court furnishings, and including effective date provisions.

[H.S.B. 335](#) Appropriations

Relating to state finances, including by making, modifying, limiting, or reducing appropriations, distributions, or transfers, authorizing expenditure of unappropriated moneys in special funds, providing for properly related matters including prohibiting state membership in the Iowa individual health benefit reinsurance association, making corrections, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions.

[H.S.B. 336](#) Appropriations

Relating to and making appropriations for the economic development of the state, including to the economic development authority, Iowa finance authority, department of workforce development, and state board of regents and certain regents institutions, and eliminating the repeal of the housing renewal pilot program.

H.S.B. 337 Appropriations

Relating to and making appropriations to the education system, including the funding and operation of the department for the blind, department of education, and state board of regents, and including contingent effective date provisions.
