BILLS SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR

A communication was received from the Governor announcing that on May 6, 2025, the following bills were approved and transmitted to the Secretary of State:

[House File 295](#), an Act relating to accreditation of postsecondary educational institutions, prohibiting adverse action by accrediting agencies against certain postsecondary educational institutions for compliance with state law, providing remedies, and including effective date provisions.

[House File 316](#), an Act relating to career education, including middle school career exploration and industry-recognized credential seals and certificates for high school students.

[House File 392](#), an Act authorizing school districts and accredited nonpublic schools to apply to the department of education for authorization to maintain a year-round school calendar at an attendance center or school for students enrolled in grades nine through twelve.

[House File 397](#), an Act relating to the address confidentiality program.

[House File 398](#), an Act relating to the duties of the director of the department of corrections, the board of corrections, superintendents, and district directors.

[House File 440](#), an Act relating to tuition, degree programs, employment, and related matters pertaining to students enrolled at regents institutions.

[House File 471](#), an Act modifying provisions related to school concussion and brain injury policies.

[House File 532](#), an Act enacting the dietitian licensure compact.

[House File 710](#), an Act relating to roofs on private docks and required insurance.

[House File 793](#), an Act relating to fire fighter training and certification.

[House File 875](#), an Act relating to health insurers' credentialing process.

[House File 885](#), an Act relating to deer and wild turkey hunting licenses for disabled veterans.

[House File 894](#), an Act relating to the release of liens on snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, and water vessels.

[House File 903](#), an Act relating to partial payments during construction of a farm-to-market road.

[House File 994](#), an Act concerning quarterly reports on and payments of beer barrel and wine gallonage taxes, and including effective date provisions.

[Senate File 148](#), an Act relating to special landowner turkey hunting licenses.

[Senate File 150](#), an Act relating to sexual exploitation of a minor, and making penalties applicable.

[Senate File 257](#), an Act relating to the display of a validation sticker on a vehicle registration plate.

[Senate File 277](#), an Act modifying provisions related to compulsory education, truancy, and chronic absenteeism.

[Senate File 296](#), an Act allowing police service dogs to receive emergency veterinary medical services while on duty.

[Senate File 398](#), an Act relating to closing costs for a debt secured by an interest in land.

[Senate File 423](#), an Act relating to deer hunting, including deer depredation and the purchasing of a youth deer hunting license and tag.

[Senate File 491](#), an Act prohibiting the use of remotely piloted aircraft flying over farm property, and making penalties applicable.

[Senate File 513](#), an Act prohibiting a court from ordering payment of a postsecondary education subsidy for a child under a dissolution of marriage temporary order or final judgment or decree, and providing for application to existing orders, judgments, and decrees.

[Senate File 573](#), an Act relating to motor vehicle glass repair, replacement, and insurance, making penalties applicable, and including applicability provisions.

[Senate File 583](#), an Act relating to school safety by requiring the creation of school safety assessment teams and authorizing information sharing between certain governmental agencies.

[Senate File 604](#), an Act relating to the measurement of units sold for purposes of cigarette and tobacco regulation and taxation, and including effective date provisions.

[Senate File 606](#), an Act relating to electronic filing of sales and use tax returns, and including effective date provisions.
