FINAL REPORT

SUBSTANCE ABUSE STUDY COMMITTEE

January, 1984

The Substance Abuse Study Committee of the Senate and House Standing Committees on State Government and Human Resources and the Human Resources Appropriations Subcommittees was established by the Legislative Council to study the structure, funding, administration and role of the Department of Substance Abuse, the details of House File 625, approved by the House of Representatives in 1983, and other concerns in the area of substance abuse.

The Study Committee met August 30, October 18, and December 13. At the first meeting, the staff of the Legislative Service Bureau provided a review of House File 625. The staff of the Legislative Fiscal Bureau provided a summary of program evaluations at the Department of Substance Abuse completed in 1981 and 1982. Information from representatives of local independent substance abuse programs not receiving financial assistance from the state and representatives of programs having a contract with the Iowa Department of Substance Abuse was received to differentiate the funding alternatives and approval of programs. Representatives from the Iowa Department of Substance Abuse, the Iowa State Association of Counties, and the University of Iowa Alcoholism Studies Program also testified. Discussion was held relating to methods of treatment and prevention offered by different programs.

The second meeting included testimony from representatives of the Department of Public Instruction explaining the efforts in substance abuse prevention and recommendations for future action, the sheriffs and deputies of the state to report needs and problems relating to substance abuse, the Iowa Substance Abuse Program Director's Association regarding community-based substance abuse

prevention and treatment programs with suggestions for legislative action, the National Council on Alcoholism and other Drug Dependencies regarding problems generated by alcohol abuse, a professor of Alcoholic Studies at U.C.L.A. to provide information on current research on prevention, the Iowa Department of Substance Abuse for remarks relating to the financing of the Department. The Study Committee discussed pending legislation, prescreening, and local planning of programs.

The third meeting consisted of a discussion regarding House File 625 and House File 564 relating to funding and planning of substance abuse programs. Several members of the Study Committee offered amendments with the combination of amendments as approved attached to this report.

Amend House File 625 as amended, passed, and 2 reprinted by the House, as follows: Page 1, by striking lines 6 through 8 and 4 inserting in lieu thereof the words "of the department 5 and an amount necessary to". Page 1, line 12, by striking the word "Seventy-7 five" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "Eighty". 8 3. Page 1, line 20, by striking the word "Twenty-9 five" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "Twenty". 10 4. By striking page 1, line 35 through page 2, 11 line 4. 5. The council shall first deduct the estimated 28 federal grants to be received by the department in 29 the same fiscal year before adjusting prices to fund 30 the increase in the net state appropriation. 31 adjustment of the price shall include the cost of 32 the twenty-five percent of the cost of treatment at 33 a mental health institute previously incurred by the 34 counties before July 1, 1985 pursuant to sections 35 125.43 and 125.44 after consultation by the council 36 with the department of human services for current 37 cost figures. Chapter 125, Code 1983, is amended by 39 adding the following new section: NEW SECTION. 125.61 FUNDING. The provisions 41 in section 125.59 shall not take effect until the 42 appropriations to the department provide sufficient 43 funding for the cost of the local programs in the 44 state plan as developed in section 125.12, subsection 45 1, at the level provided for the 1983-84 fiscal year." Page 2, by inserting after line 31 the 6. 47 following: "The funding available for implementing 48 the state plan developed by the department shall be 49 distributed by a formula based on population, need, 50 and other criteria as determined by the department
