CREATION

The Bill of Rights Interim Study Committee was created by the Legislative Council in 1985 for a two-year period of time to review actions taken by the legislatively-mandated Bill of Rights Advisory Committee and to begin the study of a fair and equitable state funding formula required to be in place before the rights for the mentally retarded, developmentally disabled, and chronically mentally ill contained in Senate File 473 can be implemented.
