

REPORT OF THE STUDIES COMMITTEE
TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(as amended and approved by the Legislative Council)

December 19, 1991

The Studies Committee of the Legislative Council met on Thursday, December 19, 1991, and makes the following recommendations:

1. That approval be given to the Civil Penalty Process Review Study Committee request for extension of its December 20 completion deadline.
2. That approval be given to the Emergency Medical Services Study Committee request to authorize rescheduling of the Study Committee's December meeting after the completion deadline.
3. That a Review of Iowa's Handgun and Offensive Weapons Laws study committee be established as outlined on the attached description, with legislative leaders authorized to appoint its members. The membership of the committee shall include minority representation. (The membership requirement was not part of the Studies Committee Report but was added by action of the Council.)
4. That the K-12 Education Reform Study Committee notice of the Study Committee's intended method of proceeding, submitted in accordance with its charge and filed with the Studies Committee, be approved as submitted. The notice includes plans to establish three subcommittees which will meet during the legislative session on weekdays at times which will not conflict with the work of the General Assembly; for subcommittees to involve the participation of various interest groups as ex officio non-voting members; and for the Committee to receive staffing assistance during the legislative session and succeeding interim period from an individual under contract with the Legislative Service Bureau.
