"Health care provider" means a physician as defined in 1 15 1 16 section 135.1, an advanced registered nurse practitioner 1 17 licensed pursuant to chapter 152, a hospital as defined in 1 18 section 135B.1, and a health care facility as defined in 1 19 section 135C.1. 20 2. "Health care services" means services that involve 21 diagnosis, treatment, medical evaluation, advice, or such acts 1 20 1 1 22 as may be permissible under the health care licensing statutes 1 23 of this state. 3.
