            "Bone marrow" means the soft tissue that fills human

        b. "Vascularized organ" means a heart, lung, liver,

1 16 pancreas, kidney, intestine, or other organ that requires the
1 17 continuous circulation of blood to remain useful for purposes
1 18 of transplantation.
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         2. Beginning July 1, 2003, state employees, excluding
  20 employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement
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1 21 which provides otherwise, shall be granted leaves of absence 1 22 in accordance with the following:

         a. A leave of absence of up to five workdays for an
  24 employee who requests a leave of absence to serve as a bone 25 marrow donor if the employee provides written verification
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1 26 from the employee's physician or the hospital involved with
1
  27 the bone marrow donation that the employee will serve as a
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  28 bone marrow donor.
       b. A leave of absence of up to thirty workdays for an
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  30 employee who requests a leave of absence to serve as a 31 vascular organ donor if the employee provides written
  32 verification from the employee's physician or the hospital
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  33 involved with the vascular organ donation that the employee
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  34 will serve as a vascular organ donor.
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         3. An employee who is granted a leave of absence under
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   1 this section shall receive leave without loss of seniority,
   2 pay, vacation time, personal days, sick leave, insurance and
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   3 health coverage benefits, or earned overtime accumulation.
   4 The employee shall be compensated at the employee's regular
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   5 rate of pay for those regular work hours during which the
   6 employee is absent from work.
         4. An employee deemed to be on leave under this section
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   8 shall not be deemed to be an employee of the state for
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   9 purposes of workers' compensation or for purposes of the Iowa

            Not more than fifty percent of the moneys in the fund

2 21 the hospital in the upper fifty percent of all protocol
2 22 compliance rates for hospitals submitting documentation for
  23 cost reimbursement under this section. The transplant
2 24 recipients, transplant candidates, living organ donors,
2 25 legal representatives on behalf of transplant recipients,
2 26 transplant candidates, or living organ donors. Transplant
2 27 recipients, transplant candidates, living organ donors, or the
 28 legal representatives of transplant recipients, transplant
  29 candidates, or living organ donors shall submit grant
  30 applications with supporting documentation provided by a
