1 12 if the value of the property or services secured or sought to 1 13 be secured by means of the credit card is greater than one ten 14 thousand dollars. If the value of the property or services
15 secured or sought to be secured by means of the credit card is 1 16 greater than one thousand dollars but not more than ten 17 thousand dollars, an offense under this section is a class "D" 18 felony, otherwise the offense is an aggravated misdemeanor.

Sec. 2. Section 715A.6, Code 2003, is amended by adding 1 20 the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 3. For purposes of this section, the 1 22 value of the property or services is the highest value of the 1 23 property or services determined by any reasonable standard at 1 24 the time the violation occurred. Any reasonable standard 1 25 includes but is not limited to market value within the 1 26 community, actual value, or replacement value. If property or 1 27 services are secured by two or more acts from the same person 1 28 or location, or from different persons by two or more acts 1 29 which occur in approximately the same location or time period 30 so that the acts are attributable to a single scheme, plan, or 1 31 conspiracy, the acts may be considered as a single act and the 1 32 value may be the total value of all property or services

1 33 involved. Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 715A.10 ILLEGAL USE OF SCANNING 35 DEVICE OR REENCODER.

- 1. A person commits a class "D" felony if the person does 2 any of the following:
- Uses a scanning device to access, read, obtain, 4 memorize, or store, temporarily or permanently, information 5 encoded on the magnetic strip or stripe of a payment card 6 without the permission of the authorized user of the payment 7 card, and with the intent to defraud the authorized user, the 8 issuer of the authorized user's payment card, or a merchant.
- 9 b. Uses a reencoder to place information encoded on the 10 magnetic strip or stripe of a payment card onto the magnetic 2 11 strip or stripe of a different card without the permission of 12 the authorized user of the card from which the information is 13 being reencoded, and with the intent to defraud the authorized 2 14 user, the issuer of the authorized user's payment card, or a 2 15 merchant.
- 2 16 $\,$ 2. A second or subsequent violation of this section is a 2 17 class "C" felony.
- 3. As used in this section:
 a. "Merchant" means an owner or operator of a retail 20 mercantile establishment or an agent, employee, lessee, 21 consignee, officer, director, franchisee, or independent 22 contractor of such owner or operator. A "merchant" also means 23 a person who receives from an authorized user of a payment 2 24 card, or someone the person believes to be an authorized user, 25 a payment card or information from a payment card, or what the 26 person believes to be a payment card or information from a 27 payment card, as the instrument for obtaining, purchasing, or 28 receiving goods, services, money, or anything else of value 29 from the person.
 - "Payment card" means a credit card, charge card, debit b. 31 card, or any other card that is issued to an authorized card 32 user and that allows the user to obtain, purchase, or receive 33 goods, services, money, or anything else of value from a 34 merchant.
 - c. "Reencoder" means an electronic device that places 1 encoded information from the magnetic strip or stripe of a 2 payment card onto the magnetic strip or stripe of a different 3 payment card.
 - "Scanning device" means a scanner, reader, or any other 5 electronic device that is used to access, read, scan, obtain,
